New Student Drop off Location

Please remember when dropping off or picking up students, use the parking lot located at the west side of the school. The driveway into this parking lot is now two way. This driveway must be used to exit. The large, one way, looped driveway is for buses only. Cars are not allowed in the loop at any time. If you are dropping your child off at school late or picking up early (prior to end of day dismissal) than you can use the parking lots at the front of the school.

Parents of JK students are invited to attend an information session on Wednesday, February 7th @ 6 pm in Room 179 @ Lakefield District Public School.

Our school hallways are very busy during the arrival and departure times, especially during the winter months with winter clothing. For this reason and for security reasons, we ask that parent/guardians drop off and/or pick up students outside the exit doors. If you need to speak to a teacher, please call and arrange an appointment or write a note for the teacher to give you a call. Your cooperation and support with this issue is greatly appreciated.

Volunteers are greatly appreciated and enrich our students' school experience. In order to volunteer you need a current Police Check that is valid for one year. Please verify the dates of your police check to be sure it is up to date if you plan to volunteer.

City Residents

If you live within the Peterborough / Lakefield City Limits you must pick up a police check request sheet from the school office and take this form with two pieces of Identification to the local police station in Lakefield. The cost is \$6.34.

County Residents

If you live in the OPP area you need to pick up the paper work at the school office and take it to the OPP station in Peterborough. You must bring two pieces of Identification.

Curve Lake Residents

Curve Lake volunteers will need to pick up a police check request sheet from the school office and take this form along with two pieces of identifications to the Curve Lake Police Station.

In October, LDPS's Nature Team decided they wanted to do something to help the environment. Something simple, that all of us could do together. They knew they needed to figure out some way to get everyone involved - so what better way than to sign us up for a contest?!! The Ontario Schools Battery Recycling Challenge is province wide and runs from October to April.

The contest started with just a few batteries being dropped off. However, as word spread that LDPS was recycling batteries, families started to bring in their stashes. The Nature Team was really happy to see how much people really do care about the earth. These families had been holding onto their batteries for quite some time, just waiting for a place they could dispose of them safely.

Now, in January, we have really come a long way. The Ontario Schools Battery Recycling Competition just contacted us to inform us of our stats. Look at what we have accomplished as a community:

Out of the 125 schools participating in the competition throughout Ontario, LDPS is sitting pretty at 19th!!!

Our last tally was at approximately 435 kg of batteries collected – that is around 960 pounds of batteries!!

Keep up the good work and spread the word. Keep bringing in those batteries – we have a battery collection barrel at the main entrance— we will be continuing to collect right through to April!
